# **JOB DESCRIPTION**

# **ROLE OUTLINE**

The post holder will work as a specialist member of the clinical multi-disciplinary team to assist in providing the highest quality clinical care and treatment for young people, their families and/or carers. The post holder will work closely with other team members from a variety of clinical and service backgrounds to provide a psychological perspective to cases. This will involve managing a caseload of complex young people with a variety of emotional mental health disorders up to the age of 18. The post holder will work across East Lancashire and be expected to travel and work from various clinical locations as required. The post holder will be expected to work across 7 days on a rota basis, participate in the self-harm rota and the out of hours advice rota.

#### **JOB SUMMARY**

- To provide a qualified specialist clinical psychology service to children, young people and their families, who access specialist children's mental health services.
- To provide specialist psychological assessment, formulation and psychological therapy.
   The emphasis is on delivering a high quality community oriented service, using evidence based practice
- To offer advice and consultation to non-psychological colleagues and to other non-professional carers where psychological intervention is a key aspect of treatment programmes.
- To work autonomously within professional guidelines and the overall framework of the service's policies and procedures.
- To utilise research skills for audit policy and service development within the area served by the service.

# **CLINICAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

- To provide specialist psychological assessments of clients referred to the service undertaking the appropriate use, interpretation and integration of complex data from a variety of sources including psychological and neuropsychological tests, self-report measures, rating scales, direct and indirect observations and semi-structured interviews with clients, family members and others involved in the client's care.
- 2. To formulate and implement plans for psychological therapy and/or management of the young person's mental health based upon a comprehensive conceptualisation of the presenting difficulties, employing methods based upon evidence of efficacy whilst maintaining a flexible approach in considering what will best meet the individual's needs. The post holder will work across a range of settings including, health centres, hospitals, and home visits.
- 3. To be responsible for implementing a range of psychological interventions for children, families, carers and groups, within and across teams. This will include modifying and refining psychological formulations in light of new information drawing upon a range of explanatory theoretical backgrounds/models and upholding a number of provisional hypotheses.
- 4. To evaluate and make decisions about intervention options taking into account both theoretical models and highly complex factors concerning historical and developmental processes that have affected the child, young person, family or group.
- 5. To manage own caseload, exercising autonomous professional responsibility for the young people whose difficulties are managed within a psychological framework, including regular communication with all others involved in the young person's care.
- 6. To provide specialist psychological advice, guidance and consultation to other professionals contributing directly to the children, young people, family and carer's formulations, diagnosis and intervention plans.
- 7. To undertake initial risk assessments for children, young people and their families and to provide advice and guidance to other professions on psychological aspects of risk assessment and risk management.
- 8. To communicate in a highly skilled and sensitive manner both orally and in writing, information concerning the assessment, formulation and treatment plans of children, young people and families under their care and to monitor progress during the course of multi-disciplinary care.
- 9. To demonstrate awareness of potential communication difficulties and/or cultural considerations and, where appropriate, adapt professional practice accordingly, involving identification of, and effective liaison with, appropriate support services (e.g. advocacy, family support, translators).
- 10. Play an active part as an autonomous practitioner in the clinical assessment and decision making around children who self-harm
- 11. Participate in the clinical on-call rota providing first line out of hours advice to clinicians and managers within ELHT when required.

# TEACHING, TRAINING AND SUPERVISION

- 1. To receive & offer regular clinical supervision, in accordance with good practice guidelines, from a senior clinical psychologist and, where appropriate, other senior professional colleagues.
- To continue to gain wider post-qualification experience of clinical psychology over and above that provided within the principal service area where the post holder is employed.
- 3. To develop skills in the area of professional post-graduate teaching, training and supervision and to provide supervision to other staff (psychologists and non-psychologists) as appropriate.
- 4. To provide clinical supervision of assistant psychologists as appropriate, to contribute to the supervision of individual cases for trainee clinical psychologists.
- 5. To contribute to the pre-and post-qualification teaching of clinical psychology.
- 6. To use multi-media materials to deliver presentations within public, professional and academic settings.
- 7. To continue developing specialised clinical competencies through attendance at relevant post qualification training and at regional networks (e.g. SIG).

#### MANAGEMENT, RECRUITMENT, POLICY AND SERVICE DEVELOPMENT

- 1. To contribute to the development, evaluation and monitoring of the team's operational policies and services, through the deployment of professional skills in research, service evaluation and audit where required.
- 2. To contribute to the management the workloads of assistant psychologist where appropriate, within the framework of the team/service's policies and procedures.
- 3. To be involved, as appropriate, in the short listing and interviewing of assistant or graduate psychologists.
- 4. To be involved in the supervision and management of Clinical Psychology Trainee placements.

# RESEARCH AND SERVICE EVALUATION

- **1.** To utilise theory, literature and research to support evidence-based practice in individual work and work with other team members.
- 2. To undertake appropriate research, liaise with the Trust Research and Development department and local ethics committee as appropriate. Provide research advice to other staff undertaking research where required.

- 3. To contribute to audit and service evaluation initiatives relevant to service provision developments.
- 4. To record clinical observations and information relevant to clients in accordance with service policy, ensuring accurate documentation of clinical activity and outcomes.

# **IT RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 1. To use IT to record personally generated clinical data.
- 2. To use e-mail, word processing, and database skills as appropriate within the service.
- 3. To use Microsoft PowerPoint packages and Excel, and use/supervise use of IT statistical analysis by assistants, as appropriate.
- 4. To ensure that all data is completed within the timeframes specified by the division and in line with the MHSHS data set requirements.
- 5. Use and comply with the requirements of IAPTUS as the electronic patient record, utilising the recording and ROMS elements to their full effect.

#### **GENERAL**

- 1. To ensure the development and maintenance of the highest professional standards of practice, through active participation in the internal and external CPD training and development programmes, in consultation with Line Manager.
- To ensure the development and articulation of best practice in psychology and adhere to the professional code of practice as drawn up by the Division of Clinical psychology of the British Psychological Society/Health Professions Council and adhere to all East Lancashire Hospitals NHS Trust policies and procedures.
- 3. To exercise the skills of reflexive and reflective scientist practitioner, taking part in regular professional supervision and appraisal and maintaining an active engagement with current developments in the field of clinical psychology and related disciplines.
- 4. To maintain the highest standards of clinical record keeping including electronic data entry and recording, report writing and the responsible exercise of professional selfgovernance in accordance with professional codes of practice of the British Psychological Society/HCPC and Trust policies and procedures.
- 5. To maintain up to date knowledge of legislation, national and local policies and issues in relation to the client group and mental health.
- 6. To participate in team meetings.

The post holder is expected to comply with all relevant Trust policies, procedures and guidelines, including those relating to Equal Opportunities, Health and Safety and Confidentiality of Information.

It is likely that the post will evolve over time. Developments across the region are likely to mean that the Regional Adoption Agency will move to a shared resource and therefore it is probable that this will mean some wider travel and work commitments around the northwest. These duties will be subject to regular appraisal and any amendments will be made in consultation and agreement with the post holder.
