The teaching component will take up 50% of the job and mainly you will be teaching students allocated to the Department of Medicine for the Elderly (DME). DME teaches students from all three clinical years and also teaches students on a post-finals "MAST" course that prepares students for clinical practice. The students come from the University of Nottingham. There will be a mix of students from the graduate entry course based at Derby, and the standard undergraduate medical course.

In your teaching role you will be responsible to Dr Rob Skelly, Consultant Geriatrician. You will work with an experienced nurse clinical educator.

You will have some responsibilities to help with teaching or examinations outside of DME as directed by the education department. The education department employs a number of teaching fellows to help with this work.

You will have opportunity to teach at the bedside, to conduct small group teaching in the education centre (sometimes with volunteer patients) and on the simulation suite. There will be opportunity to develop and evaluate new teaching sessions.

We will support you to complete a post-graduate certificate in clinical education at University of Nottingham.
