Job Purpose:

Provide a flexible and comprehensive dietetic service to both Medical and Surgical Directorates.

To support the delivery of a high quality, safe and compassionate healthcare service, all staff are expected to act as a role model to others in all aspects of their work and consistently demonstrate NNUH's 'PRIDE' values of People focused, Respect, Dedication, Integrity and Excellence.

Overview of Essential Responsibilities:

Clinical Responsibilities

- 1. To provide a dietetic service to Medicine for the elderly wards, general medical and surgical wards, heart attack clinic and general outpatient clinic.
- 2. To provide dietetic advice to patients and/or carers whilst taking into account their social, emotional, psychological and cultural needs.
- 3. To provide nutritional assessment and dietetic intervention, on an individual basis, incorporating biochemical and pharmacological review, anthropometry, clinical condition and other physical parameters.
- 4. To ensure appropriate treatment, monitoring and review of patient's dietary needs, involving other agencies when indicated.





- 5. To communicate effectively with the multidisciplinary team through attendance at ward rounds, case conferences, discharge planning meetings and team meetings as appropriate.
- 6. To recommend to Doctors the prescription of nutritional supplements and enteral feeds for outpatients, and arrange monitoring.
- 7. To prescribe nutritional supplements for inpatients within the specific guidelines agreed by the Trust.
- 8. To be trained in the use of enteral feeding pumps and equipment, to be confident to advise nursing staff, patients and carers.

Professional Responsibilities

- 9. To undertake an annual appraisal and personal development review.
- 10. To ensure own practice is up to date and evidence-based. Able to demonstrate an awareness of current relevant research through teaching and peer review.
- 11. To produce evidence-based literature and resources for patients and healthcare professionals.
- 12. To provide teaching and education sessions to medical, nursing and catering staff.
- 13. To participate in the training of student Dietitians (after an initial settling in period to be agreed).
- 14. To maintain accurate and comprehensive patient records in line with legal and departmental requirements, and to communicate outcomes to the appropriate disciplines in the form of letters and reports.
- 15. To work in accordance with the standards set by the British Dietetic Association and the Health Professionals Council.
- 16. To be legally and professionally accountable for all aspects of own work, including the management of patients within own care.
- 17. To participate in departmental and clinical audit.
- 18. To advise and liaise with catering staff concerning the dietary needs of patients.
- 19. To support other members of the team and provide cover in their absence.
- 20. To assist in the induction of new staff and act as a mentor supporting and teaching other members of trained and untrained staff as required.
- 21. To contribute to the education and assessment of student Dietitians.





- 22. To attend and participate in department meetings and study days.
- 23. To undertake regular (i.e. weekly monthly depending on needs) clinical supervision with Band 6/7 Dietitian.
- 24. To input data onto the in-house dietetic management system and collate reports, in accordance with department guidelines.
