Job Purpose

The post holder will provide a comprehensive administrative service within their team.

Key Responsibilities

Clinical / Service Specific

1. Typing all forms of correspondence, reports and summaries that are required by the team.
2. Undertake diary management for clinicians and/or managers, as required.

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3. Organise clinics and associated appointments for clinics, using appropriate brought forward systems to manage work.
4. Provide operational support to colleagues, and supervision of Band 2 administration staff within the team, if required, as directed by Line Manager.
5. Inputting and updating service user information and service user/team activity on computerised information systems, creating service user notes where necessary and according to policy.
6. Maintain filing in both paper and electronic records, ensuring that it is kept up to date at all times. In accordance with Trust procedures, track and receive notes in a timely manner.
7. Ensure good customer service by providing a professional and effective telephone service, taking accurate messages and providing information and signposting as requested and appropriate.
8. Undertake training of new staff as directed by Line Manager and/or other managers.
9. Provide cover as directed by Line Manager for other members of the admin team in their absence and assist with their workloads as necessary and undertake such other duties as may be reasonably required commensurate with the grade of the post.

Essential Behaviours and Attitudes

- Listens actively and respectfully to others.
- Identifies and challenges unacceptable practice of peers and colleagues respectfully, and takes appropriate action to resolve.

- Works in partnership and collaboration with others; respects their rights and promotes equality at all times.
- Responds to an individual's situation, needs and preferences and does not stereotype people.
- Develops trust with service users and colleagues through delivering what they say they will and having a flexible approach to their work.

- Monitor and maintain stocks of stationery and resources, acting as authorised requisitioner to ensure that stocks are replenished.
- Assist in the effective use and maintenance of the office environment and clinical room space in the base, and leading on the introduction of, and work with, systems to manage this effectively.
- Train in the use of new technology which may be introduced into the department, and support other staff where required.
- Support communication with colleagues and users of the service through negotiation, influencing, listening and understanding, to ensure effective joint working.

- Be aware of the Trusts Incident reporting systems in line with Health and Safety and Risk policy requirements.

Training & Development

- To participate in regular supervision in accordance with good practice guidelines and Trust policy.
- To participate in the Trust's annual Appraisal process.
- To attend all relevant mandatory training as and when required to do so.

Quality & Patient Safety

- Protection of Children & Vulnerable Adults – To promote and safeguard the welfare of children, young people and vulnerable adults.
- Implementation of NICE guidance and other statutory / best practice guidelines. (if appropriate)
- Infection Control - To be responsible for the prevention and control of infection.
- Incident reporting - To report any incidents of harm or near miss in line with the Trust's incident reporting policy ensuring appropriate actions are taken to reduce the risk of reoccurrence.
- To contribute to the identification, management and reduction of risk in the area of responsibility.
- To ensure day to day practice reflects the highest standards of governance, clinical effectiveness, safety and patient experience.
- To ensure monitoring of quality and compliance with standards is demonstrable within the service on an ongoing basis.
